The crucial geographic position:

- Major area in the Horn of Africa
- Trade routes: Mediterranean–Red Sea–Indian Ocean
- A bridge between Asia and Africa

Unique civilization:

- Meeting place of peoples and cultures since the 1st millennium BCE
- The oldest Christian and Islamic civilizations in sub-Saharan Africa
- Repository of ancient history and legends
- Ethiopia is considered the only African state that was not colonized
- Decisive actors in the Red Sea politics

Extraordinary written traditions:

 Unique syllabic script, in use since two millenia: the c.200 graphemes are easy to learn!

AN ESTABLISHED TRADITION IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

- The only university in Germany where Amharic (lingua franca of present-day Ethiopia), Geez (Classical Ethiopic, still used in Church) and Tigrinya (lingua franca of presentday Eritrea) are regularly taught
- Courses in manuscript cultures, Geez and Amharic literatures, history, and methods of text analysis
- Integration of philological and linguistic studies, Semitic studies, religious studies, ancient, medieval, and modern history
- Dedicated teaching and research staff
- Contemporary issues introduced by guest professors from around the world
- Yearly Summer Schools for international students
- Partnerships with universities and institutions in Ethiopia and Eritrea

BA IN AFRICAN LANGUAGES AND CULTURES: PROFILE MANUSCRIPT CULTURES

- Duration: 3 or 4 years / 180 or 240 credit points
- Language of instruction: German (with some courses optionally in English)

In addition to common courses in African linguistics, you will be introduced to manuscript cultures of Africa as well as to the history of Ethiopia and Eritrea. You will reach an intermediate level in Amharic and Geez and have a possibility to study Tigrinya. A stay in Ethiopia is part of the 4-year degree programme.



MA IN MANUSCRIPT CULTURES

- Duration: 2 semesters / 60 credit points
- Language of instruction: English

The course promotes the analytical work with manuscripts (not limited to Ethiopia). You will learn to examine not only texts but also images, notes and diagrams transmitted in the manuscripts and gain insights into the scientific (physical, chemical) analysis of the materials used.

You will learn to apply creative approaches to solving complex scholarly problems. One-year fellowships (800 €/month) are offered.
