

The Man from Bangkok: Rong Wongsavun describes the Americans



'Rong Wongsavun was one of the most important Thai writers of the twentieth century. Between the 1950s and his passing in 2009 he wrote newspaper articles, published photographs, wrote novels and non-fiction books. He had a particular talent for seeing Thailand and

the world through the eyes of common people. He also took his journalistic eye to California in the 1960s to observe life in San Francisco, where he was a correspondent for the Siam Rath newspaper. His observations of

California were collected into a book On the Back of the Dog: The Golden Sunshine in 1978. The book was published in English last year as The Man from Bangkok: San Francisco Culture in the 60s. In the book he seeks to answer the question many Thai people of the 1970s were asking: "Why are the Americans the way they are?"

Dr Tony Waters is a Professor of Sociology. Currently he teaches at Leuphana University Lüneburg, Germany. Previously he was at Payap University in Chiang Mai (2016–2022), and California State University, Chico (1996–2021). Long before that he was a Peace Corps Volunteer in Phrae, Thailand (1980–1982), and worked in refugee camps in Nan and Phanat Nikhom (1982–1983). In order to work on his Thai language skills, he taught a Thai-English translation course at Payap University in 2016–2017. The translation from 'Rong Wongsavun was initiated in the context of this course.
