#### Introduction

#### **Program's Content and Qualification Aims**

The general objective of the International M.A. program in Tibetan Studies ("Tibetology") at the University of Hamburg is to further train students to independently and critically investigate any given theme dealing with various aspects of the Tibetan culture transmitted primarily in the form of written texts. For the successful fulfilment of this objective the acquiring of two skills is decisive: (a) proficiency in both classical and modern Tibetan, and (b) skills in the employment of historical-philological tools and techniques. Given that Tibetan culture is predominantly impregnated with Buddhism, the program lays emphasis on Tibetan Buddhism. Courses thus include seminars on Tibetan philology, Tibetan Buddhist literature, religion, philosophy, culture, and history of ideas, in which a variety of texts in classical Tibetan are studied in depth. Tibetan Buddhist textual scholarship is one of the main research areas of the Department and is well represented in teaching. By the end of the course, students will have acquired their skills in using sources in classical (and also modern) Tibetan for research, and will have deepened their knowledge of the Tibetan civilisation.

## Admission requirements (List of all admission requirements as per the current admission bylaws)

#### **University degree**

A Bachelor's degree "Sprachen und Kulturen des Indischen Subkontinents und Tibet" from the Universität Hamburg or a comparable Bachelor of a German or officially recognized international academic institution in one of the following subjects: Language and Culture oft the Indian Subcontinent and Tibet (focus on Language and Culture of Tibet), South Asian Studies (focus on Tibet), Tibetology or an equivalent subject. a first qualifying degree of a German or officially recognized international academic institution with a minimum of 50 credit points (ECTS) in courses with a clearly tibetological focus.

If you have not received your degree certificate yet, you can submit this by the end of the first semester of your master's program. Please see the "Documents to submit" section below for details.

## Additional special admission requirements

Proof of competence in classical Tibetan with a minimum of 20 credit points or proof of an equivalent language training.

In case no sufficient evidence for competence in one modern language of the Indian subcontinent or Sanskrit can be provided within the application period the candidate will have the possibility to undergo a placement test conducted by the Universität Hamburg which has to be passed.

Tibetan Native Speakers need a proof of competence in classical Tibetan with a minimun of 20 credit points (ECTS).
